## A NOTE ABOUT TODAY'S SERVICE

*At first glance it may be assumed that the final chapter of Philippians is a rather random series of unconnected bits of counsel. We must remember that originally the books of the Bible were not divided by chapters and verses. Philippians is a letter to a church. And while it is the inspired and unerring Word of God it is also a letter to a church. Those who still write letters understand the tendency to close with various updates and final words of encouragement.*

*But a deeper reading of the letter to the Philippian church reveals that its closing portions are anything but random or haphazard. Like Paul's other letters, the final section of Philippians is filled with illustrations and applications of the teachings which make up the body of the letter.*

*In the opening verses of chapter four Paul takes the rather unusual step of calling out by name two members of the church who were at odds. We do not know the cause of the division nor does Paul show any interest in rehearsing any of the details. He simply calls upon them to "agree in the Lord." He also instructs the church to help them bridge the divide.*

*Division between brothers and sisters in Christ is never a strictly personal matter. Because of the effect division has upon the church's health and witness it is a matter for the church to address. Clearly this must be done with wisdom and grace. Paul does not approach Euodia and Syntyche with a rhetorical club as he does with false teachers. Rather he appeals to them as a brother in Christ and co-laborer in the gospel. Unity in the church is never simply about personal comfort. It is directly related to the church's ability to stand firm in the midst of attacks from without and within.*



**A Survey of Church History, Part 5: *The Nineteenth Century, 1800-1900 A.D.*, meets in the sanctuary:** If we want to understand ourselves and our churches, we need to know where we've been. Despite rising Darwinism, growing liberalism, waves of revivalism, and other tremendous challenges, the nineteenth century was a time of fervent missionary endeavor and a growing Church. In this fifth series, Dr. Robert Godfrey surveys the landscape of the nineteenth century, illuminating the triumphs and failures of that age so that we may understand the opportunities and challenges of our own day. There will be a 23-minute video lecture by Dr. Robert Godfrey followed by discussion. This class is facilitated by Elder Lyle Jacobsen.

**Sex & Money, meets in Multi-purpose Room West:** Pleasure. We live in a world obsessed with finding it, passionate about enjoying it, and desperate about maintaining it. Chief among such objects of affection are sex and money – two pleasures unequaled in their power to captivate our attention and demand our worship. In *Sex & Money*, this Paul David Tripp DVD pulls back the curtain on the lies of our flesh and the ways we distort God's good gifts, examining the insanity of our culture and exposing our tendency to fall prey to the hollow promises of this world. In exploring how God's grace frees us from futile pursuits, Paul directs viewers to the wisdom of God in Scripture and the liberating power of the gospel, offering practical guidance on finding true joy and enduring satisfaction. This class is facilitated by Greg Becker, Director of Congregational Care and Counseling, and Covenant member John Barlow.

**Gospel-Centered Life, meets in Annex 6:** Many Christians speak of the Gospel, but how many really understand it and apply it to their lives? We want to love and be loved, yet living in the church often ends up being harder than we thought. This course teaches how the gospel seizes our hearts, shapes our everyday lives, and transforms us into a genuine community. This class is taught by Pastor Aaron Roberts.

**All Nations Fellowship, meets in Annex 3:** The purpose of the class is to create a welcoming dynamic for people from all nations. Each Sunday we feature a different country or culture, integrating Bible Scripture with cultural content. **Today we feature Germany with Hanna Shumway describing her recent year of experience at a German university and what German youth are thinking these days.** Bring your international neighbor, co-worker, or friend with you to the class. 
